SUBJECT: Sector 4/End of Month Report/April 2012

During the month of April 2012, Officers assigned to Sector 4 were Officer Contreras, Officer Dean, Officer Spencer and Officer Bray.

Officer Bray has continued following up on items hanging from power lines within the city and notified the Edison Power Company regarding several locations.

Officer Bray and Officer Dean have also identified that officers have responded to the 300 block of North York Street on three separate occasions this month in regards to client running away from the home. She is developmentally disabled and diagnosed bipolar. 72 hour mental health holds were issued on her when located, but mental health would release her. Officer Bray and Officer Dean met with the group home supervisor and the CVRC manager in hopes of developing a solution that can benefit all parties. The group home supervisor advised officers that the client had recently started new medications and believed this to be a contributing to her behavior. Her physician was contacted and advised of the erratic behavior. The client's medication has since been altered and there have been no further reported incidents.

Officer Contreras and Officer Spencer identified a problem in the 300 block of North Indiana. Resident has been the source of numerous calls for service at the location. He has been a nuisance to the neighbors within the complex by being loud, yelling and being intoxicated. He was arrested twice this month for public intoxication and disturbing the peace. Officer Contreras and Officer Spencer spoke with the manager of the complex and advised her of the tenants behavior. The manager was provided a history of calls for service and the manager has said a meeting was scheduled with the tenant to alter his behavior or face eviction.

On April 27, 2012, Officer Contreras and Officer Spencer contacted this subject at his residence. They explained to him that his recent behavior and cause for police response is unacceptable to the citizens in his apartment complex. Officer Spencer and Officer Contreras offered to assist hiim with finding Alcoholic Anonymous counseling services if he felt this would help him. As of today there have not been any further reported incident or contacts with the tenant.
